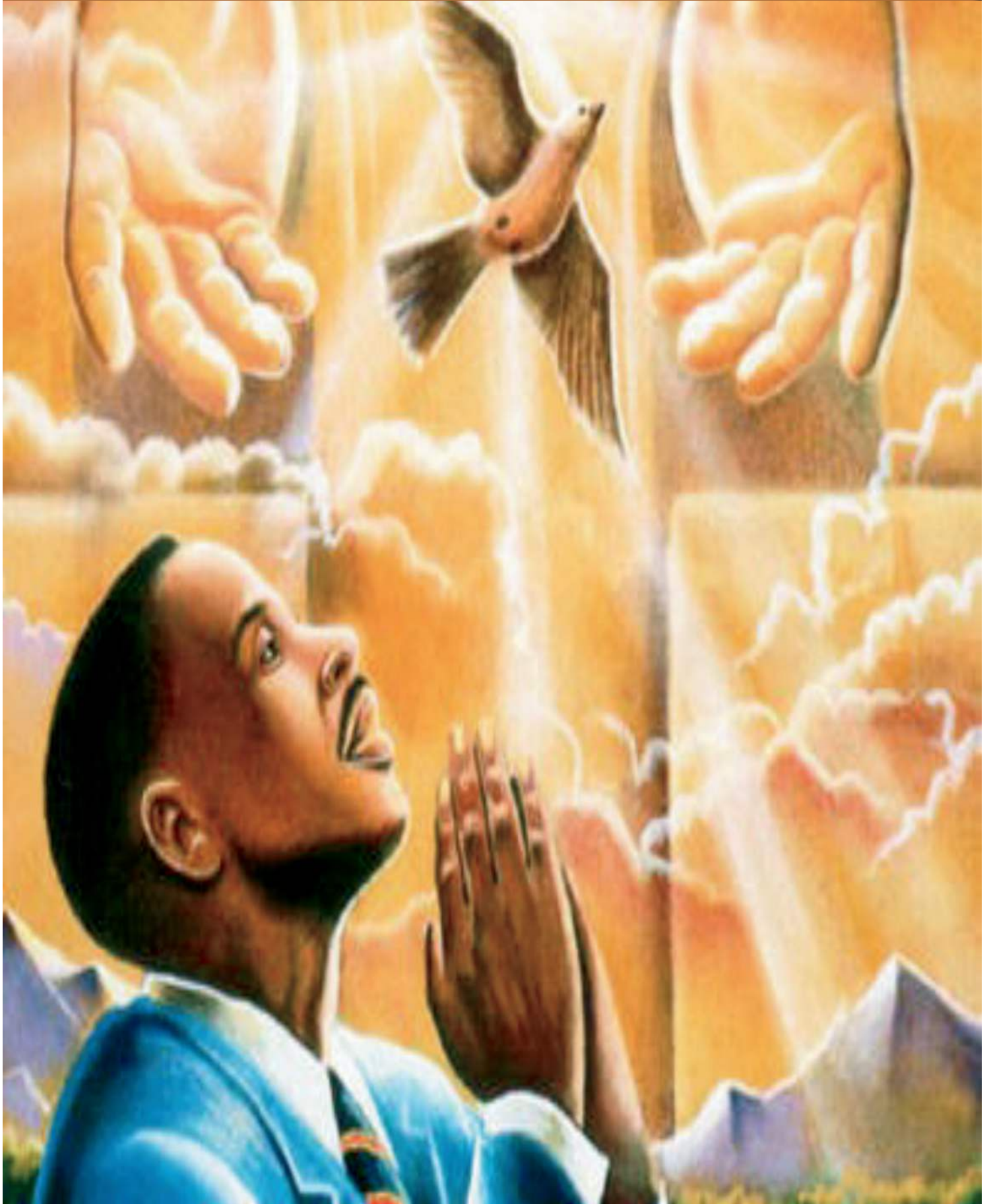

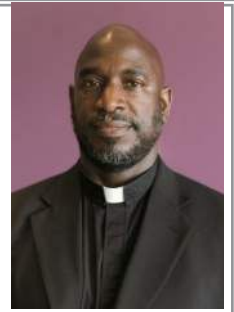

The Readings for this Sunday

**Old Testament—Sirach 27:30-28: 7,
Ps 103: 1-2, 3-4, 9-10, 11-12**

**New Testament—Rom 14: 7-9,
Gospel— Mt 18: 21-35.**



In our reading from the Book of Sirach, we are asked to be a person of forgiveness and mercy. The writer asks us a simple question: How can we seek the mercy of God if we are not willing to show that same mercy to our fellow Brothers and sisters? We are asked to remember the Commandments and to love our neighbor.

Our reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans, Saint Paul answers the age-old question of who do we belong to. This for us is an odd question for we value our freedom and our independence. But Saint Paul is not talking of slavery but rather to whom we give our allegiance. We belong to God through Jesus our Lord. This is why it was important that Jesus became man to save us. When Jesus became man, He showed us that we cannot live alone; living for oneself and dying for oneself. No, we must live in such a way as to take care of each other. Through Christ we belong to the Lord so we live and die for the Lord. And to live and die for the Lord is to love one another.

In our Gospel from Matthew, how often must I forgive my brother or sister? This is the question that Peter asks of Jesus. Our Lord tells Him that we must forgive not seven times but seventy-seven times. Now Jesus is not asking us to keep track of how often we forgive and when we reach a certain number, we stop forgiving. What would happen if God were to do this towards us? I would dare to say no one would be in heaven. The point that our Lord was saying is that we must be a person of mercy and forgiveness.

Jesus will tell us the Parable, the servant who owed a debt to a king. When the servant begs for more time the king in compassion forgives the entire debt. Now this same servant comes to a person who owes him a debt and what does he do he has him thrown into prison. The king when heard of this had the servant thrown into prison for not showing the same mercy that was given to him. If we seek forgiveness and mercy from God should we not be willing to do the same?

del Antiguo Testamento, Eclesiástico (Sirácida) 27, 30 – 28, 7 y Salmo 103 (102), 1-2, 3-4, 9-10, 11-12
del Nuevo Testamento, Romanos 14, 7-9
el Evangelio, Mateo 18, 21-35



En nuestra lectura del Libro del Eclesiástico (Sirácida), se nos invita a ser personas de perdón y misericordia. El autor nos plantea una pregunta sencilla: ¿Cómo podemos buscar la misericordia de Dios si no estamos dispuestos a mostrar esa misma misericordia a nuestros hermanos y hermanas? Se nos pide recordar los Mandamientos y amar al prójimo.

En la lectura de la Carta de San Pablo a los Romanos, el apóstol responde a la antigua pregunta de a quién pertenecemos. Para nosotros, esta es una cuestión curiosa, ya que valoramos nuestra libertad e independencia. Sin embargo, San Pablo no habla de esclavitud, sino de a quién entregamos nuestra lealtad. Pertenecemos a Dios por medio de Jesús, nuestro Señor. Por eso fue importante que Jesús se hiciera hombre para salvarnos. Al hacerse hombre, Jesús nos mostró que no podemos vivir aislados, viviendo y muriendo solo para nosotros mismos. No; debemos vivir de tal manera que cuidemos los unos de los otros. Por medio de Cristo pertenecemos al Señor, así que vivimos y morimos para el Señor. Y vivir y morir para el Señor significa amarnos los unos a los otros.

En el Evangelio de Mateo surge la pregunta: ¿Cuántas veces debo perdonar a mi hermano o hermana? Es lo que Pedro le pregunta a Jesús. Nuestro Señor le responde que debemos perdonar no siete veces, sino setenta veces siete. Jesús no nos pide que llevemos la cuenta de las veces que perdonamos para dejar de hacerlo al alcanzar una cifra determinada. ¿Qué sucedería si Dios actuara así con nosotros? Me atrevería a decir que nadie estaría en el cielo. Lo que nuestro Señor quiere transmitir es que debemos ser personas de misericordia y perdón.

Jesús nos cuenta la parábola del siervo que debía una gran suma a un rey. Cuando el siervo suplica más tiempo, el rey, movido a compasión, le perdona toda la deuda. Sin embargo, ese mismo siervo se encuentra con alguien que le debe dinero y, ¿qué hace? Lo manda encarcelar. Al enterarse, el rey hace encarcelar al siervo por no haber mostrado la misma misericordia que había recibido. Si buscamos el perdón y la misericordia de Dios, ¿no deberíamos estar dispuestos a hacer lo mismo.

Order of Christian Initiation for Adults

What is OCIA?

The OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) is simply Faith Formation. Any adult who is interested in receiving the sacraments of initiation: **Baptism, first communion, penance and confirmation** must learn and embrace the Catholic Faith.



The OCIA thus includes people in several different situations:

Candidates: Previously baptized in other Christian churches and desire to become Catholic. Those who are potentially seeking the sacraments of first communion and confirmation.

Catechumens: Are those that have not been previously baptized in any Christian church. Catechumens are potentially seeking all three sacraments of initiation: baptism, first communion, and confirmation.

Confirmandi: Are those that have been previously baptized in the Catholic Church but never received the sacrament of confirmation. After the OCIA, confirmandi receives the sacrament of confirmation.

Inquirers: Inquirers are non-Catholics who want to explore the possibility of becoming Catholic. If they find themselves ready to proceed, they will become candidates, catechumens, or confirmandi.

Our parishes have been offering OCIA Class for those who have not had a chance of receiving sacraments when they were growing up as teenagers. We offer class on Saturday. We will start our first class on October 10 at 9 am as a team will teach the class. The location is Cathedral of Holy Angels. It is also important that the candidate will attend the mass every weekend so that he or she understands the rhythm of Catholic Faith and use of sacraments. As of now, I have a few potential candidates to attend OCIA classes. If you are interested you are welcome to join us. Also, If you have already received those sacraments and would like to learn Faith more deeply in the Lord, you are most welcome to join. It does not cost money, rather it is your interest.

If you are among those people in several different situations and want to receive Sacraments, please contact Fr. Jay or Fr. Mosley.

¿Qué es el OCIA?

El OCIA (Orden de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos) es, sencillamente, formación en la fe. Cualquier adulto interesado en recibir los sacramentos de iniciación —Bautismo, Primera Comunión, Penitencia y Confirmación— debe aprender y abrazar la fe católica.

Por tanto, el OCIA abarca a personas en diversas situaciones:

Candidatos: Personas bautizadas previamente en otras iglesias cristianas que desean hacerse católicas. Son quienes buscan recibir los sacramentos de Primera Comunión y Confirmación.

Catecúmenos: Personas que no han sido bautizadas previamente en ninguna iglesia cristiana. Los catecúmenos buscan recibir los tres sacramentos de iniciación: Bautismo, Primera Comunión y Confirmación.

Confirmandos: Personas bautizadas previamente en la Iglesia Católica pero que nunca recibieron el sacramento de la Confirmación. Tras el proceso de OCIA, reciben dicho sacramento.

Interesados (o aspirantes): Personas no católicas que desean explorar la posibilidad de hacerse católicas. Si deciden seguir adelante, pasarán a ser candidatos, catecúmenos o confirmandos.

Nuestras parroquias ofrecen clases de OCIA para aquellos que no tuvieron la oportunidad de recibir los sacramentos durante su adolescencia. Las clases se imparten una vez a la semana (día por determinar) y comenzarán en octubre, a cargo de un equipo de instructores. Es importante que el participante asista a Misa cada fin de semana para comprender el ritmo de la fe católica y el sentido de los sacramentos. Actualmente, cuento con uno o dos posibles candidatos para las clases de OCIA; si usted está interesado, le invito a unirse. Asimismo, si ya ha recibido dichos sacramentos pero desea profundizar en su fe y en el conocimiento del Señor, también es bienvenido. El programa no tiene costo alguno; lo único que se requiere es su interés.

Si usted se encuentra en alguna de estas situaciones y desea recibir los sacramentos, por favor comuníquese con el P. Jay o con el P. Mosley.
